PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I would like to acknowledge the Wurundjeri and Bunurong people of the Kulin Nations, on whose land we play and gather. I pay my respects to their Elders, past, present and emerging.

What a year! Our club has come a long way from its humble beginnings in 2012 at Sasses Ave. Back then we were a junior club fielding three teams, carting all our equipment in a trailer and were managed by a handful of volunteers. Skip forward to 2019 and we're now a senior club with more men, women and children playing than ever before.

The 2019 season has been the biggest season in our small club's history. We had 145 registered players and 41 volunteers across the Rugby League club. There was another 110 men, women and teenage players registered in our 2018-19 summer touch competition and our Switch program doubled in participants.

This year we had a complete Executive Committee and general committee. I would like to formally acknowledge and thank Lynne Simpson (Secretary), Kevin O'Neill (Vice-President), Rose Ousley (Treasurer), Benjamin Smith (Coaching Director) and Alex Pynor (Facilities Director) for all their hard work and huge efforts this season.

I'd like to extend that thank you to our general committee, touch football committee and team of fantastic volunteers. To all our Coaches, Assistant Coaches, Team Managers, Assistant Team Managers, Sports Trainers, Water Runners, Canteen/BBQ helpers, Ground Managers, Fundraising and Events coordinators/contributors, Merchandise, Uniform, Sponsors and any other volunteers I have missed, THANK YOU. Without your involvement and enthusiasm we would not be able to operate.

At last years AGM we welcomed three new Life Members to the club. Congratulations to Benjamin Smith, Kevin O'Neill and Simon Lindberg on your induction.

As I reflected on the year it became more and more apparent that we are not just a rugby league club and touch association. We are a team of determined, strong and supportive people. We are a family. WE ARE RAPTORS.

Over the summer months we held our second season of Touch Football. There were 9 teams registered in our social mix comp. The Switch program was facilitated by Emma Smith and a big hit with the ladies in the area. Great job by Richard McMurray and Tim Baird for running the season.

We have females represented in most our junior teams, a dedicated U13 girls tackle team, 3 U17 girls on permit (just so they could get a game) and our inaugural senior women team who stepped up this year into the big leagues. Congratulations to Jenna-Lee Roberts on her selection into the Victorian U16 Girls Team (They also won the tournament). We now have a clearly defined path way for our girls to play from Juniors to Seniors.

One of our first social events happened before the season kicked off. We were finalists in last years VICNRL Spirit of League. All the finalists were invited to attend the Indigenous All Stars v Maori All Stars. 30 lucky raptors took a chartered bus into AAMI Park and had a DEADLY night.

We all got together again a couple days later to do some filming for our CLUB RESPECT partners, Nirodah and the ABC. Lots of our raptors getting the opportunity to make their prime time debut... February was a busy month for us considering we don't launch until late March.

Just as we were getting into the swing of preseason, we had our 5 seconds of fame! Our Club respect ABC feature aired nationally on March 1 on the brekky show and repeated all day!

We've had a few of our squads representing us on the hallowed turf at AAMI. Some of our U7/8's, along with our U9/10 and 13 girls all getting the opportunity to get on the main stage. Our U13 girls were involved in banner duties at Cam Smiths 400th. A squad of four Girls/Women represented us at the annual Club Sprint Challenge. During the Storms finals campaign we had various kids doing banner duties, as well as our U10 & U9 play pre game and doing sprint races! Well done to everybody that has had the opportunity to play at AAMI Park and represented us the way you would expect raptors too!

In June the club was invited along to the Knox Councils annual Sporting Clubs Awards night. Raptors were finalists in Best Club Initiated Program - SWITCH, Club Of the Year, Club Person of the year - Trent, Club person of the year - Emma Smith (Junior). It was great to be nominated and make the finalists for each category, but the best part of the night was when Emma took out Club Person Of The Year - Jnr. Congratulations again Emma, we appreciate all that you do.

One of the biggest social events for the Raptor community was our annual trivia night. This years went into overdrive with not much knowledge shared or gained, but at least a fair old crack at being out past bedtime. Thanks to Prue and the fundraising team for making it a huge success.

A majority of our storm crazed junior members would argue that the BIGGEST night ever happened on 16th July.... Storm in Your Club seen the GOAT Cam Smith and his mates Tom Eisenhuth and Ryan Hoffman come to our club for the evening. The looks on the kids' faces when they realised it was Cam was priceless. A great night getting tips and hearing stories (and maybe a few selfies/autographs) from the GOAT and Co. A huge thank you to the Storm crew, Cam, Tom and Raptor Ryan for making the night one our kids won't forget in a hurry.

Our masters got together for a series of 3 Gala Days. The Masters definitely love getting the chance to dust off the boots and pull a hammy or pop a shoulder. Four of our masters have progressed through to the VicStormers State team. Hopefully next year we can get a few of our Raptor mums in for Women's Masters.

We've hosted various programs, had most of the state teams train at our grounds, holiday activities and school events outside of our regularly scheduled games on Saturday. We've had Lenny Mason host a NJPP (National Junior Participation Program), League Stars and tackle safe programs throughout the year. We've also been fortunate enough to host the Kenny Bromwich and Cam Munster Shields. Thank you Lenny, NRL Victoria and our volunteers for making all these things possible.

The major highlight for 2019 though, is the guaranteed upgrade and delivery of our brand new change room facilities! In March we held a press conference at Colchester Reserve with the Local council, Cricket Australia and State government attending to make the significant funding announcement. This just doesn't happen. It has taken years for us to be able to get to this stage. Several committees' later (and a proven girls/women program) and we are achieving those big dreams of our founders. On August 28 the car park was fenced in and works begun. We are expecting a completion date of late October. We're all looking forward to seeing the final product. We also had professional goal posts added to the international Pitch. Next step is our social space.

The game of rugby league is why we are all here. We played 18 rounds of seniors and 14 rounds for our juniors. Whether it be taxi-ing our children, volunteering, playing, barracking in wind, rain and hail or supporting the club with purchases and donations, thank you for making the commitment to your club, and your Raptors.

2018-19 Starting Total (banked): \$25,538.91 | Target: \$26,000.00 | Finish Total (banked): \$25,269.40

Thank you to a dedicated Executive Committee, team of wonderful volunteers and supporters for helping to achieve the 2018-19 banked total of \$25,269.40. Slightly short of our target (\$26,000) and last season's banked total of \$25,538.91. Regular reporting of unpaid fees enabled the committee to effectively keep track of payments which made a considerable difference to the bad debt total \$3,179.50. Tighter End-of-Year spend (saving \$4,500) and reimbursement for damaged Goal Posts also enabled the club to finish financially strong in preparation for the 2019-20 season.


Overall income \$64,369 vs Overall expenditure \$64,639

Both income and expenditure were lower this season despite the addition of a Senior Women's Team, the U14 Boys and U13 Girls teams. Uniform fee included the sale of Jerseys (previously loaned), which was itemized separately when invoiced. This allowed for an acceptable increase of registration fee by \$55.00, as well as the standard fee to cover Association and Competition costs. The standard fee was changed to Mini, Mod, International and Senior range (previously in age range) contributing to a higher total income for registration fees (up \$4,415). Council, TFA and NRL Vic fees collectively were lower by -\$1,248 when compared to last season.

Colchester Reserve missed hosting some Home Games, and when we did host, were unlucky to have poor weather with heavy rains, hail, flooding, lightning and/or a short schedule. Canteen sales were lower (-\$850) however a better planned spend plus donations helped keep expenditure down to -\$1,497. The extra efforts provided during training nights making a difference to the overall canteen contribution as profit/loss improved on last year by approximately \$647. Raffles and fundraising also showing lower income numbers due to missed opportunities (-\$2,406), although smarter spending (-\$3,466) resulted in an approximate \$1,000 improvement when compared to the previous year figures.

Team Expenses doubled this year with the purchase of player kits up \$6,169.18 when compared to 2017-18. The club is seeking reimbursement from Struddys for poor quality items of approximately \$1,200. %5 Loyalty rebate also yet to be received because of dispute.

Despite ending \$269.49 short of last year's banked total, the club is in a good financial position with high prospects for 2020. The new goal posts and change room facilities may alter the look of the club, but the Raptor heart and fighting spirit remains consistently the same and will continue to get us over the line every time. Well done team!

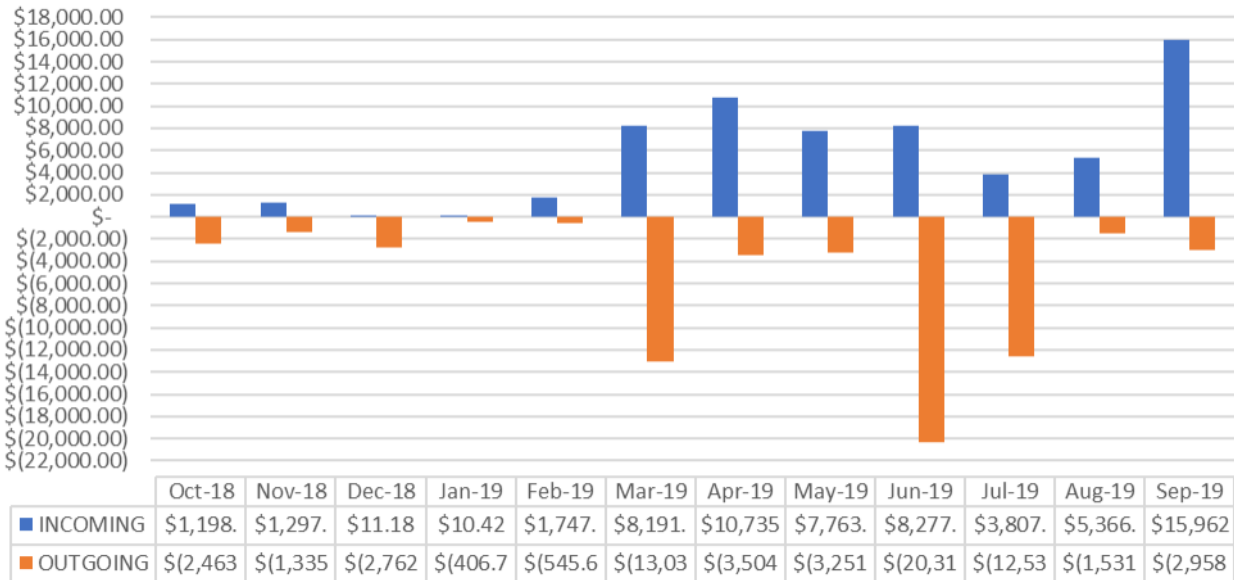


CASH FLOW

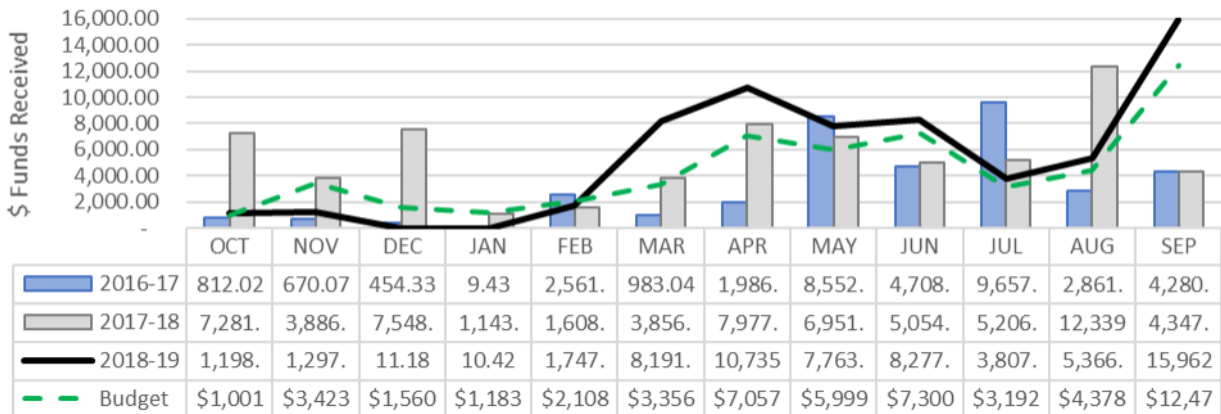

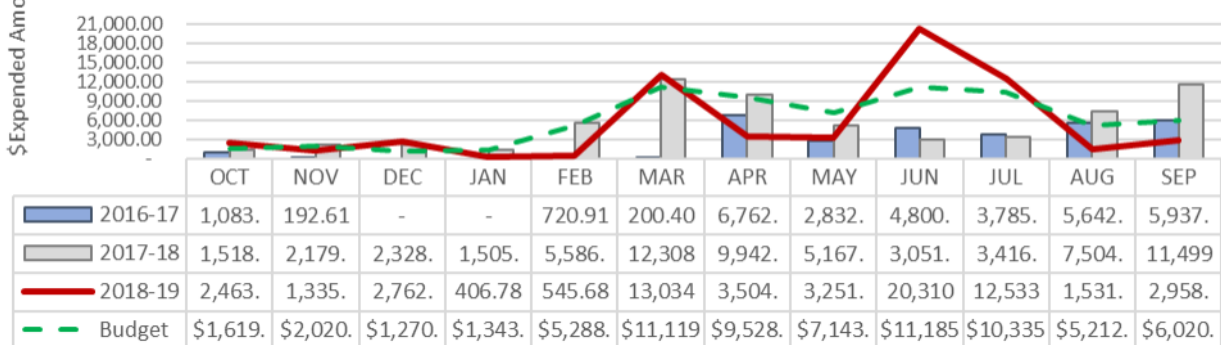
2018-19 CASHFLOW

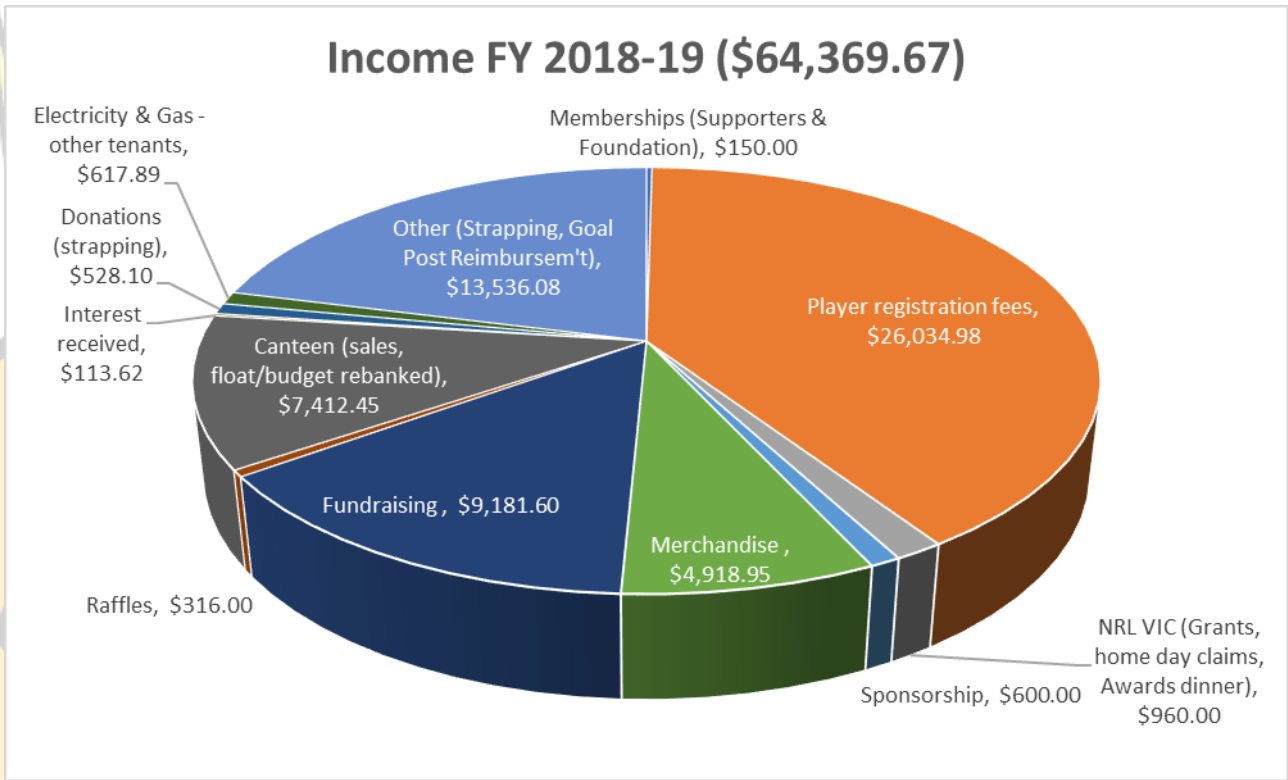

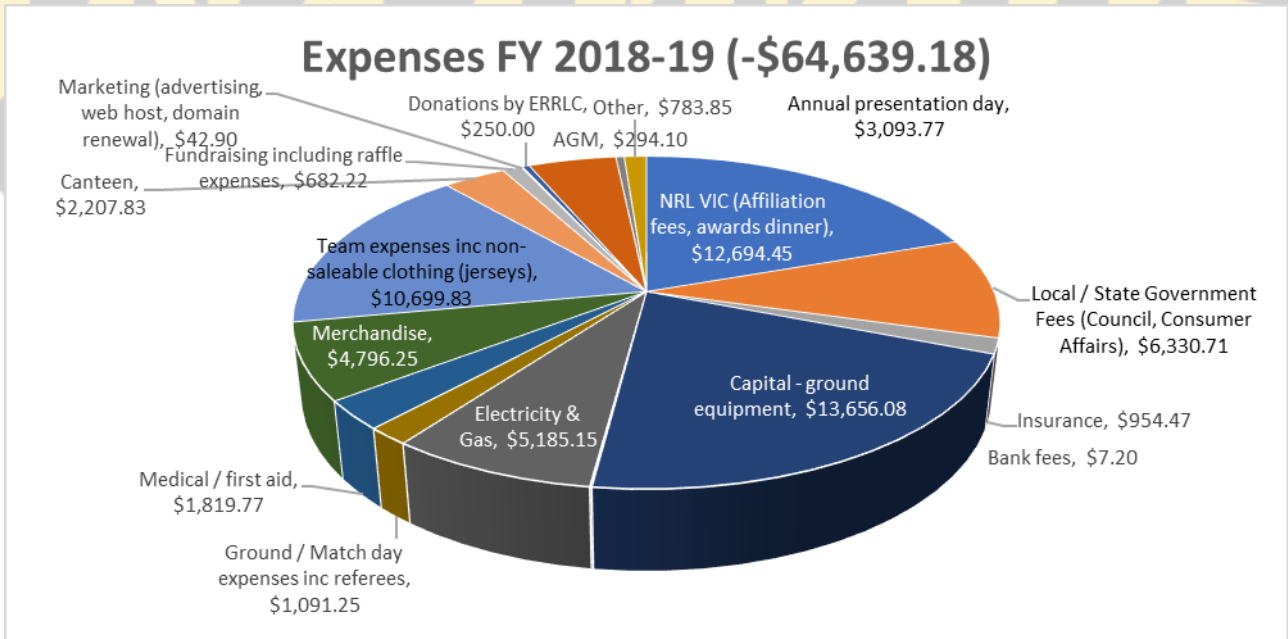

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE PERIOD ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2019

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

In order to assist in understanding the financial statements of the Eastern Raptors Rugby League Club and Touch Association, the following explanations of significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these statements are as follows:

Financial Reporting Framework

This special purpose financial report has been prepared for the distribution to the members to fulfil the Committee's financial reporting requirements under the Accounting Standards and the Associations Incorporation Act Victoria 1981. The accounting policies used in preparation of this report, as described below are consistent with the financial reporting requirements of the Eastern Raptors Rugby League Club and with previous years, and are, in the opinion of the Committee appropriate to meet the needs of members.

The report has been prepared in accordance with the following Accounting Standards:

- AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements
- AASB 108 Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors
- AASB 107 Cash Flow Statements
- AASB 110 Events after the Balance Sheet Date
- AASB 116 Property, Plant and Equipment
- AASB 118 Revenue

No other Accounting Standards have been applied.

The financial report has been prepared on a cash basis, and its historic costs does not take into account changing money value, or except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. The accounting policies adopted have been consistently applied with those of the previous year.

Taxation

The Eastern Raptors Rugby Club and Touch Association is a Not for Profit Organization and under the Associations Reform Act 2012 is categorized as a Tier 1 Organization is not registered to pay income tax nor GST and is not legally required to audit accounts.

Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment is expensed at the time of the cash outflow.

Income and grants

Grants recognized as revenue in the reporting period which were obtained for a particular purpose, have been applied to that purpose.

Expenses

Expenses are recognized when the Eastern Raptors Rugby Club and Touch Association makes payments resulting from the purchase of goods and services.

REGISTRATIONS: Invoice for fees and uniform were billed together as separate line items.

FUNDRAISING: Bunnings Sausage Sizzle & Trivia Night were major contributors.

MERCHANDISE: Reduced sale of old ERRLC apparel including merchandise (polos, hoodies, beanies) and player jerseys. Stickers was an added item.

DONATIONS/GRANTS/SPONSORSHIPS: Donations consisted of players contributing to strapping and the reimbursement for replacing a set of Goal Posts. Sponsorship from Jackson Taylor in the form of an advertising sign hung on boundary fence. Ian Knight Photography provided free images and discounted team photos. Ringwood RSL provided free function room for Events.

4. INCOME STATEMENT – EXPENSES

Knox Council, TFA & VRL AFFILIATION FEES includes Council fees, TFA Competition Fees, NRL Referee expenses, NRL Competition fees and Awards Dinner table costs.

MERCHANDISE: New apparel ordered when deposit paid reducing risk of unclaimed/not paid stock.

PLAYER UNIFORM: Rush order resulted in higher rate paid for poor quality result. Secretary is liaising with Struddys for reimbursement of retained stock.

ELECTRICITY & GAS: Usage on average same as last financial year however Touchees contribution and other clubs' reimbursement resulted in greater return.

AGM fees not recorded as the printing of the AGM booklet cannot be completed prior to 30 September 2019.
