TREASURER'S REPORT

Eastern Raptors Rugby League Club and Touch Association Inc. Financial Statements 1st October 2020 through 30th September 2021

(Unaudited)

The committee members of the Eastern Raptors Rugby League Club and Touch Association declare that in the opinion of the committee, the financial report presents fairly the financial position of the Eastern Raptors Rugby League Club and Touch Association as at 30 September 2020 and its performance for the period ended on that date and the notes to the financial statements comply with accounting policies outlined in Note 1 to the financial report.

At the date of this declaration, there are reasonable grounds to believe that the Eastern Raptors Rugby League Club will be able to pay its debts as and when they become due and payable.

Due to the covid pandemic our season was again cut short early, however unlike 2019/2020 we were able to some matches including 6 home games before the season was officially cancelled in July.

The year we saw major delays in received uniforms ordered due to factory shut downs with the pandemic, only receiving with 2 games left in the season. However with their on field loyalty scheme we will see a future refund coming our way of approximately \$125.00. This along with grants of \$3,000.00 which enabled us to purchase a tablet, Wi-Fi and square (eftpos) machine has made receiving fees and boosted canteen sales (\$5000) exponentially easier. We are also looking to receive approximately \$1,200.00 in refunds from VICNRL due to the shortened season having only played 60% of scheduled games. There was also approximately \$900 recovered from overdue fees and merchandise orders from previous seasons.

Overall income for the year was \$43,687.40 vs overall expenditure of \$29,343.30.

Most income was generated from registration deposit and fees \$21,377.19, uniform and merchandise \$6,690.99, Canteen 5083.81 and Fundraising efforts including Bunnings raffles, mothers day raffle and easter raffle \$1185.23 and as above grants totalling \$3,000. There is approximately \$1,700 in overdue invoices some of which may be adjusted to late registration and only playing 1 or 2 games.

Major expenses this year were registration fees to VICNRL \$5,455.20 (refund coming as above), Merchandise and Uniform purchases \$5,622.60 and electricity and gas \$4,886.84. There will be a number of future purchases that should also be considered in this report but are yet to be finalised due to the current lock down and pandemic they are as follows.

- \$3,273.60 bill paid for touch paid in October 2021 which should be added to the expenditure.
- The committee also voted to get new goal posts for the mod field which has been delayed due to covid which will cost approximately \$10,000 installed.
- End of season costs, including but not limited to trophies and presentation costs Possible reimbursements for senior off field uniforms not supplied

Moving forward I would like to see an accounting system in place to enable us to track and trace our expenses better, we currently use a "free" accounting software to invoice only. I would also like the future committee to consider the Touch Association to have their own bank account for better traceability.

All in all my first year in the treasurer position has certainly had its struggles but I have loved seeing the growth throughout the club. I feel the club has a strong financial standing and I can't wait to see the future success on the backing of a full season.

Thank you to the committee who have helped with my transition into this position and I hope for a smoother run in 2021/22

There is still some stock of soft drinks etc down at the park but until restriction ease there isn't much we can do about that, would be great to be able to open the kitchen on touch nights if this goes ahead this year to sell off whats left and maybe make a little extra profit for the club.

The kitchen saw a new fitout funding by the local council which while making the kitchen look nice and bright was not an improvement in practicality but I guess we should say a thank you to the council none the less.

That's a wrap from me – I hear nobody reads these anyways, Enjoy the off season and hopefully we get to see you all around the park for a complete 2022 season.

TOUCH REPORT

The season start was delayed (from November to early December) due to COVID restrictions. But with a COVID plan in place, we completed the season at the end of March (running a little longer to ensure a full 12 week season + finals).

This year we added a men's competition to the usual mixed competition and have 4 teams in each competition. With the success of both comps, we will be looking to the 2021-2022 season to possibly expand the scope (pending eased restrictions).

An increased social media presence meant increased interest in the comp. As we continued updating our Facebook page throughout the year, there is also a healthy amount of interest for the upcoming season.

On top of this we built a pool of referees - both existing and a batch of new local refs thanks to running a referee's course. We were also ably assisted by a group of volunteers to help us ensure we have all the necessary setup to run a COVID-safe competition. We'd like to extend our thanks to all of the refs and volunteers who came down each week to assist. Without them, we wouldn't have had such a smooth running competition.


Financially, the budget showed modest profit compared to previous years. There are a number of factors contributing to this, including COVID and expanding the competition. We are hoping with the momentum built this year that we will be able to also build profit in subsequent years. Using the MySideline app for team entries and having teams properly managed meant that all teams were financial by Round 3. Further assisting us, Touch Football Victoria agreed to provide us a discount on our affiliation fees this year given the late start we made and the somewhat muted advertising we had due to uncertainty around restrictions. Final figures for the season showed a \$618 profit.



MEMBERSHIP SNAPSHOT


Despite the uncertainty around season 2021, we recorded 177 registered participants. This is our second highest total ever, and an increase of 5 over our 2020 registrations.

We entered 7 junior teams and one senior team in 2021, down from 9 and 2 in 2019.











The under 6's team was very dynamic and came together each week to learn to play as a team, make friends and have fun under the guidance of Coach Una Tafuna and Team Manager Jasmine Vassallo.

Each week at training the team joined in fun games and built friendships and learnt about teamwork.
