What an amazing year we had in 2022! On just about every measure, this year has been a resounding success, culminating in being awarded the 2022 Spirit of League award at the NRLVIC awards on 8 October.

This doesn't just happen. This is the result of everyone in the club pulling together to be the best we can be both on and off the field. The Spirit of League award is based on a weekly survey of our club by the clubs we compete with and the referees. The assessment is based on club officials' behaviour, player behaviour and crowd behaviour.

The year started with Vice President Jasmine, under 11 player James, and I attending the season launch at AAMI Park and includes the following highlights:

- A record 200 registrations, including a retention rate of approximately 55% post-Covid. This has led to us becoming one of the top 10 clubs for size in NRL Vic competition for the first time.
- We were awarded hosting rights for semi-finals, although we were ultimately unable to host due to condition of grounds
- We were selected to host the first metro gala day for our Masters, which although small was a great day out.
- Our Under 9's were lucky enough to play 2 games at half time at AAMI Park
- We were asked to pilot the following programs:
 - Tidy HQ, a club management and administration system
 - An in-club referee's course, delivering 8 new Foundation 1 referees
 - Munchkin League (activities for 3-5 year olds), which will start shortly
- Our senior men finished the year as Second Grade Minor Premiers, the first minor premiership in club history.

Throughout the year, all our teams demonstrated growth in their size, skill and performance thanks to our dedicated coaches, team managers and trainers. You can read all about their achievements in the team reports. The reorganisation of the senior competition into 3 grades was a genuine benefit to the Raptors, giving us the ability and incentive to compete for a spot in 1st grade for the first time. While our men fell short of that goal in the finals, their season was a resounding success and has set the tone for the coming years.

Congratulations must go to all our club award winners and a huge thankyou to everyone who volunteered their time, expertise, supplies or advice throughout the year. Whether turning a sausage, putting out cones, obtaining sponsorship or taking on a dedicated volunteer role, this club thrives when everyone pulls together. I also want to make a special mention to those players who received 5 year medals this year. Each year this number grows and if we maintain our current retention rate, we will soon be handing out our very first 10-year medals. Finally, congratulations to Carl Bardsley and Lynne Simpson who were both finalists in the NRL Vic awards for Coach of the Year and Volunteer of the Year respectively.

Despite reducing our playing fees this year, we have maintained our financial stability thanks to the hard work of our canteen volunteers, the support of our sponsors, various fundraising initiatives, and good management of our finances. Our aim is for everyone to be able to play the game and we do not want the cost of playing to be a disincentive.

There is still much to be done in the coming years, however if we use 2022 as the benchmark, then this club can only continue to be successful.

How great was it to have a full year of League.

Whilst overall we have had a successful season on and off the field, this year has seen the accounts take a major hit with preapproved items finally being able to be installed, and therefore paid for.

Overall income for the year was \$61,856.49 vs overall expenditure of \$78,822.78. with a net loss of just over \$13,000.

Most income was generated from registration deposit and fees \$15,563.84. Although our numbers were up this was actually down on previous season due to girls not paying fees and reducing overall fees for juniors and seniors. Uniform and merchandise \$6,398.47, Canteen \$17,800.62 included in the this total for canteen is approximately \$750 that was raised for our future stars during our wood raffle and a grant totalling \$1,000. There is approximately \$2,538 in overdue invoices some of which have since been paid. There is also approximately \$500 income due to cover Masters players who have ordered jerseys.

Major expenses this year were registration fees to NRL Vic \$6,119.00, Merchandise and Uniform purchases \$18,959.90 and electricity and gas \$4,709.93, Grounds \$13,930.88 Canteen \$9,575.42. There will be a number of future purchases that should also be considered in this report but are yet to be finalised due to the current lock down and pandemic they are as follows. Uniform/Merchandise numbers are high due to a number of factors, following on from last years report we didn't reimburse senior players for off field uniform they were purchase this season, we also purchase \$700 dollars worth of sideline jackets for our older team to enjoy - unfortunately our good will has backfired and some have been taken. We have chosen to also stock some product and hopefully moving forward will be able to run a small merchandise shop at all our home games, we will endeavour to do a complete stock take over the next few weeks.

End of season costs, including but not limited to presentation costs Possible reimbursements for senior off field uniforms not supplied Council \$1652 in unpaid fees due to ground conditions

We have this year trialled Tidy HQ, an Administration and Financial system, for the NRL and it has some huge bonuses compared to previous manual systems, but there is a ways to go with reporting on a financial basis - Lynne may touch on this a little also.

Overall I am pleased to see how great the canteen has gone this year and it was very rewarding to hear direct feedback from other clubs who appreciate our prices and variety. As I already said the new system has it downfalls and one of which was balancing our Square (eftpos) system, please take into account whilst I would love to say the canteen made a profit of approx. \$9,000 due to tracking there is probably approximately \$1000 that could be allocated to either uniforms or Merchandise. We are currently working to update the system to enable canteen staff to print details reports on when uniform or merchandise is purchased. When calculated together there is a profit of approximately \$2500 cash in bank, with \$1000 worth of head gear and approximately \$3000 in uniforms and merchandise still for future sale.

To finish of I would like to thank everyone for their support and look forward to making some money next year, with a lot of our long term goal purchases now complete, we should see more profit and less expenditure next year.

Our 5th season was again delayed due to the last of the COVID lockdowns starting in December. We completed the season at the end of March (running a little longer to ensure a full 12 week season + finals), hopefully for the last time.

This year we added a 6 week women's competition to the men's and mixed competitions bringing the overall number of players registered to our competition to the highest it's ever been.

With the returning army of volunteers and refs the competition was very successful as well as a lot of fun. There was also some exciting games being played. The men's final, in particular, being one of the fastest and most frenetic games of touch I've ever seen (the game had three high level refs who subbed amongst each other and still came away looking more exhausted than some of the players).

Financially, the competition returned a profit of around \$2000 to the club - a massive improvement on last season. This coming season will be something of a building season with forecast participation heavily favouring mixed and junior competitions.

I'd like to call out a massive thanks to CJ Williams who has retired as coordinator after the end of this season. His tireless efforts to promote and grow the comp were a thing to behold and greatly contributed to the competition's profitability. His efforts were also recognised with a Touch Football Australia Volunteer of the Month award during this season.

The competition is in a very healthy position with growing interest in the upcoming season through word of mouth and social media. From its modest start, the comp has grown year on year and will continue to evolve next season.











PLAYER REGISTRATION TREND BY YEAR




2022 REGISTRATIONS BY TYPE AND GENDER



2022 REGISTRATIONS BY GENDER




2022 REGISTRATIONS BY TYPE




2022 CONTINUING V NEW REGISTRATIONS



With thanks to my team manager Dave, assistant coach Oscar, and unofficial assistant coach Ryan, along with help from all the parents week in and week out, we managed train this large group together and manage game days with a minimum of fuss. I have one of the most engaged groups of parents in the club and I thank you all for your support and contribution throughout the year.

Some of them found dedicated roles in dummy half and first receiver, others developed their defence, whilst others honed and improved their try scoring abilities. Choosing my player and rookie of the year from each team was the most difficult challenge I faced this year with so many standout performances. The winners were thoroughly deserving however every child should be proud of their effort this year and I look forward to continuing the journey next year.

Rugby league is one of those games in which you learn a lot about yourself - and this season certainly helped all of us learn. The teams grew in skill and courage as we trained through a wet season on a rapidly deteriorating field. The feared belly runs we would sometimes do at practice were also loathed by those doing the laundry. It was great to grow with the teams this year; to watch them take the field and play with the values on display in our clubrooms every week. They were a great group and I hope to see them all again next year.

I'd like to thank Cooper Byrne, my assistant coach for the year. New to the club this year but not new to rugby league, his knowledge of the game and his eye for talent were very helpful. The insights he provided were invaluable and he added a lot to the team.

I'd also like to thank Elise Suhle and Angela Willey for backing up as our team managers for another year. They kept us on time and in the right spot as well as filling out the mountain of game day paperwork to keep us compliant.

And finally, thanks to all the parents and supporters. It's great to see so many of you coming out to support this team; it really means a lot to have you with us.

All up 2022 was a huge year.
